Yet in most factory farms in Australia (where 95% of pigs are raised) mothers and their young endure a life of pain and misery.

Each year more than 300,000 mother pigs watch helplessly as their newborn piglets' teeth and tails are cut off without pain relief, but their babies' screams are only one of the horrors mother pigs endure.

In factory farms they are treated as breeding machines, most are imprisoned in tiny individual cages, hidden from public view. A metal frame surrounds their bodies providing them with no choice but to give birth on a hard floor whilst preventing them from protecting and nurturing their piglets. Current laws allow this cruel treatment.
