



Pigs are naturally inquisitive and love to explore their surroundings.

Pigs are intelligent and social animals. In nature they keep their nests clean and cosy and form strong bonds with their group members.

Yet in Australian factory farms (where 95% of pigs are raised) hundreds of thousands of mother pigs (sows) endure a cycle of suffering.

Cruel laws allow pregnant pigs to be individually confined in tiny cages during their 16 week pregnancy. Unable to turn around, their sole choice is to stand or lie on a concrete floor.

Most mothers are forced to give birth in even smaller cages on hard floors. Protecting or nurturing their newborn is impossible. They watch helplessly as their piglets scream while their teeth are clipped and their tails are cut off without pain relief.

Pregnant sow stalls are banned in the UK on welfare grounds.
